## QUALIFICATIONS

- 1. Minimum educational requirements:
  - A. has passed a general educational development (GED) test indicating high school graduation level;
  - B. is a high school graduate.
- 2. Is 21 years of age.
- 3. Is a U.S. citizen;
- 4. Pass a written examination.
- 5. Pass a physical agility test.
- 6. Pass a criminal background investigation.
- 7. Pass an oral interview.
- 8. Pass a polygraph test.
- 9. Pass a psychological screening, physical exam and drug test.
- 10. Possess 20/20 vision, either corrected or uncorrected in each eye. Uncorrected vision cannot exceed 20/100 in each eye, unless vision is corrected by the use of contact lenses which must be worn on duty and/or during all enforcement related activities. Must be free of dichromatic color blindness, night blindness, and any other visual deficiencies or limitations.
- 11. Possess uncorrected or corrected hearing within a normal range, and uncorrected hearing cannot exceed a 60 decibel loss.
- 12. Be of good moral character.
  - The attributes of a prospective employee that enhance his or her value to the department and the goals of community-oriented policing which include honesty, integrity, truthfulness, obedience to the oath of office and the code of ethics, respect for authority, and respect for the rights of others.
- 13. Any other standards set by law or by policy of the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement.
